Report from the 6th Sysmex UK User Symposium

On November 5th and 6th 1999, Sysmex UK held the 6th UK User Sysmposium since their formation in 1991.

The attendance at these meetings has continued to rise to such an extent that it is now necessary to hold separate Haematology and Haemostasis user symposia on alternate years.

1999 was the first time that a Haemostasis symposium had been held. A total of 200 delegates attended included guests from Dade Behring, Sysmex Europe and Sysmex Corporation. The delegates were mostly technicians although a number of research and clinical doctors were in attendance. The scientific programme consisted of a total of ten speakers mostly from UK with guest speakers from Germany, Netherlands and France. All of the speakers made excellent presentations and the topics included global screening for throm-bophilia, factor VIII testing and reactions at the endothelial level. A dedicated session was held which covered the PFA-100 from Dade Behring which is distributed in UK by Sysmex UK. This was very well received. Delegates agreed that the scientific programme was very informative and well-balanced which led to some lively discussions.

Sysmex UK would like to thank all speakers, chairpersons, delegates and guests who attended the symposium and we trust that you all found the meeting enjoyable.

On November 10th and 11th 2000, Sysmex UK will be holding a Haematology Symposium at Stratford-On-Avon in Central England.
